Students report increased agreement:

Hauora (Physical Health & Mental Well-being)

Students report increased agreement:

- That students include others who are being left out or ignored and stand up for others (>55%)
- That their teachers are interested in their culture and family background (> 48%)

Physical Activity:

Increased numbers of students participating in regular physical activity measured through Sport, PE Department and Form Teacher data

Assessment management:
