The best girls' racing team in Australasia!

Westlake has seen many individual, team and group successes in academic, sporting, musical, and cultural arenas this year – far too many to share with you here. Some recent highlights.

We are the national basketball, sailing, and ki-o-rahi champions, and Auckland champions in badminton, hockey, snowboarding, rugby 7s and advanced open debating.

Sailing champions

The Westlake sailing team was one of three NZ girls' teams invited to represent NZ in the September Interdominion Teams Racing Regatta in Sydney. This followed their wins in the Auckland and then the NZ Secondary Schools' Championship earlier this year. The sailing competition pits the three top NZ and Australian girls sailing teams against each other.

The young team of eight, with six juniors, sailed brilliantly to take the Women's title for the event, making it the best girls' racing team in Australasia.

The team manager, **Paula Satterthwaite (Knauf)**, Class of 1989, whose daughter is in the team, is a former student of Westlake and an experienced sailor. Among Paula's successes was winning the NZ Women's Match Racing Competition in 2000, along with fellow Westlaker **Amy Mulcahy (Waring)**.

Basketball champions

Westlake's premier basketball team won the New Zealand Secondary Schools' Championship for the second time in a row. This fantastic win has led to their invitation to the World Schools Championships in Macau, China, in June-July 2024. This is a bi-annual competition and is only open to national champions.

Music awards

Westlake musical groups continue to excel at regional and national competitions, with premier choirs, Choralation and Cantare, winning gold and 'Best Performance' awards at the national finale.

Instrumental groups - Westlake Symphony Orchestra, Chamber Orchestra, Concert Band and Big Band won gold at the KBB awards and also 'Best Performance' awards in their categories.

Combined schools' production

One of the two productions for 2023, 'Into the Woods' won the supreme award at the Auckland Live Showdown theatre awards – 'The Best Production of 2023', competing against 29 plays and musicals for 30 awards. In total, the show won seven awards – a remarkable achievement.

Service to the Community – House Fundraising



Westlake strongly believes in the importance of service to the community, and this year, our Houses collectively raised a great deal of money for their charities. **\$19,200** in total - an outstanding effort!

Their charities were Akoranga House - The Heart Foundation, Hauraki House - Frankie to the Rescue, Onewa House - Pillars, Pupuke House - Respect, and Wairau House - Mobility Dogs. In addition, the Houses raised money for NZ Red Cross/Cyclone Appeal, Rising Swans/Star Jam, Pink Shirt Day, and Daffodil Day.

Hala Barakat (Class of 2019)

Hala Barakat is in her final year of a Bachelor of Engineering degree at the University of Auckland. She was Head Prefect in 2019 and has continued to take on leadership roles at university. These include being on the Executive Council of the Faculty of Engineering, being a Residential Advisor in student accommodation, and this year, the

student representative of the university governing body – the University of Auckland Council.

Katie Perkins has had a long and notable career as a White Fern cricketer (2012 – 2020) and she played for the Auckland Hearts for over 15 years. She retired from playing in February 2023, with over 120 international matches across all formats. Katie has balanced this with working as a police officer in South Auckland, mainly in community roles engaging with young people. Most recently, her role has been in the Supported Resolution team in Manukau.

Katie was Deputy Prefect and Sports Prefect at Westlake and was involved in many sport and service activities. Cricket was her main sporting passion from a young age.

The Arts

University of Auckland 2023 Arts Student of the Year



Thira Sels (Surakel), Class of 2020, has been named the 2023 University of Auckland Arts Student of the Year – a huge honour.

Of the five sub-categories, she was the Culture and Community category winner. Fellow Class of 2020 student Charlotte Print was the Leadership category winner.

Many charities and organisations commended Thira for her community involvement, particularly in the mental health field. This includes 216 volunteer hours with Anxiety Org’s Helpline, at least six hours a week at Auckland Hospital working with dementia and stroke patients, volunteering at The Big Gay Out, with the LGBTQ+ community, and in Ryman retirement villages. She was also the Academic Co-ordinator for the university’s summer programme, and tutors in philosophy.

Thira has just completed a BA, majoring in Psychology and Philosophy. She will study for a Master’s in Health Psychology next year. She recently received a scholarship to study an intensive language course in Germany and will spend the summer break there.

At Westlake, Thira completed Level 3 with Excellence and was involved with Amnesty and MUNA.

Peter Burn - Westlake Foundation Student

Peter Burn, a Westlake High School foundation student from 1957, recently received a Lifetime Membership award from the Pumphouse Theatre in Takapuna.

He has been on the theatre board since 2011 and Chairperson since 2015.

Peter's keen interest in Westlake continued after he left in 1961. He subsequently joined the Board of Governors of Westlake Girls, becoming the Chairperson for several years, and he has been active in helping organise alumni reunions for the school's co-ed founders.

Peter had an extensive career in the airline industry in New Zealand and the USA. He was a senior accountant at Air New Zealand and a senior management team member. He also led a large logistics company in North America and had a management contracting role at Auckland Council Property. He held various roles over a long period at city and local government level on the North Shore, reflecting his strong sense of community. These roles include being a city councillor, local board member and a long association as a trustee and former Chair of the Kaipatiki Community Facilities Trust.

Peter comments, "I have always had a strong affiliation to Westlake Girls as that was the home where the foundation pupils, both boys and girls studied and where we were taught by memorable, dedicated teachers and learned the many skills that gave us our start in life.

I well remember going out of bounds to swim in Lake Pupuke at lunchtime and receiving the cane for doing so. The lake at the time was a reserve water supply for the North Shore and not to be swum in or used for any recreational sport. Look at it today with Olympic gold medallist canoers and many water sports athletes using it extensively.

We saw the school grow from two classroom blocks, to include the old hall and two new classroom and administration blocks. As a Board Member of Westlake Girls during its formative years, I was proud to be part of its rapid growth during the 1970s and 1980s and am fortunate to have seen the school become one of the country's foremost girls' secondary schools, with its enviable facilities and teaching staff. As past pupils, you all contributed to the growth, and I hope that Westlake also has strong memories for you."

Holly Haines, Artist



Holly Haines (Class of 2016) is an emerging impressionist landscape artist based in the UK. In October, she had her first solo exhibition at the Takapuna Art Gallery, ‘Art by the Sea’. Holly is currently studying classical oil painting at the Edinburgh Atelier of Fine Art, and the exhibition featured several works that follow her journey from NZ to Edinburgh.

Holly excelled at Westlake, particularly in painting, gaining an NCEA Level 3 Scholarship award. She followed her passion for art and studied at Auckland University of Technology. She has previously exhibited and sold her artworks at North Shore galleries.

Andrea Nelson, MNZM

Andrea Nelson (née Wilson), Class of 1993, was appointed as a Member of the NZ Order of Merit (MNZM) for her services to sport in the King's Birthday Honours. In September, she received her insignia from the Governor General, Dame Cindy Kiro. We warmly congratulate Andrea on receiving this high honour.

She was CEO of the ICC Women's Cricket World Cup in 2022, leading the upgrade of facilities to host the event, which saw a record-breaking sold-out final at Hagley Oval

and 1.64 billion video views.

At Westlake, Andrea was more interested in the arts than sport. She enjoyed English and debating and took part in school productions. She was attracted to the media, and after leaving Westlake, she undertook a year stint as a radio host with 95bFM while completing a Post-Graduate Diploma in Journalism at AUT.

Andrea's involvement in sport started with her work at the 2012 London Olympics from 2005 to 2012. This led to key roles in the 2015 FIFA U20 World Cup held in NZ (Director of Communications and Marketing) and the 2017 Rugby League World Cup (General Manager). Until recently, she was Chair of Northern Region Football. Currently, she is the CEO of Gymnastics NZ.

Last year, she was an entertaining guest speaker at the Westlake Father-Daughter Breakfast event.

Holly Gray, NZ Rowing Squad Summer 2023



Holly Gray (Class of 2017) has been named in the NZ Rowing Squad for summer 2023. She has been rowing for about ten years and, in 2019, was in the NZ U21 Trans-Tasman rowing team.

Holly has just finished studying for a Master's in Sports Exercise and Health at AUT. She has had various placements and jobs related to sport, fitness and well-being, including being a fitness consultant at Auckland Council, a research assistant at AUT Sports Performance Research Institute, and a student performance technique analyst intern at High Performance Sport NZ.

She has been based in Cambridge since April, working as an F45 Training instructor and front of house at a café in Cambridge while completing her studies and training towards selection for the rowing team.

Kate Burley, Silver Ferns Netball Squad



Kate Burley (Class of 2014) has been named in the Silver Ferns Squad for 2023/24, having previously been in Silver Ferns development squads. Kate has been playing as a defender in the ANZ Premier League for several seasons - with the Northern Stars, Northern Mystics, and most recently, the Southern Steel, where she was named Player of the Year 2023.

She was in the 2022 Netball FAST5 Ferns team that won bronze in the Fast5 World Series last year and the 2023 World Series, where they came second.

Kate has been studying full- or part-time for over eight years, juggling this with her playing commitments. This year, she graduated with a BSc from the University of Auckland, majoring in Psychology and Physiology. Kate is considering part-time post-graduate study if she can fit it around her new full-time two-year contract with the Northern Stars from 2024.

Rebecca Sowden, Fixing the Internet



Rebecca Sowden (Class of 1999) is a former New Zealand Football Fern, USA division one college soccer player and New Zealand Women of Influence Finalist (contribution to sport).

Rebecca has spent 17 years running the sponsorship and marketing for some of the world's leading sport and entertainment properties.

These include Hong Kong Rugby Sevens, Volvo Ocean Race, FIFA U-17 Women's World Cup, Masterchef and Idol. She also started her own sport technology start-up and

national beach soccer series.

Rebecca is a founding partner of Team Heroine and *Correct the Internet*, led by her passion for supercharging women's sport. *Correct the Internet* has become a global campaign to correct gender bias on the internet and make women in sport more visible.

At Westlake, she played in the top football teams and was in the 1998 1st X1 that won the Secondary School Championship. She played in the NZ U17 and U19 representative teams. A football scholarship took her to William and Mary College in Virginia in 2000, where she completed a Bachelor of Business Administration in 2004.

Amelia Linzey, CEO Beca Group

In October 2023, **Amelia Linzey (Class of 1989)** became Beca's new CEO. Beca is one of Asia Pacific's largest independent advisory, design and engineering consultancies.

Amelia is the first woman and non-engineer CEO to lead the group.

"It is a huge privilege to help make an impact on the next decade of Beca," says Amelia, who has worked there for over 25 years. Beca was founded in 1920 and is well into its second century, with more than 4,000 workers in 25 offices worldwide and delivering projects in more than 70 countries.

Before her CEO role, Amelia was Beca's Group Director – Advisory, Chief Planner, and Chair of Beca's Sustainability Steering Group. She was also a Director of both the Beca Group and Beca NZ boards. In April 2022, Amelia was selected as one of a small group of business leaders to accompany the then-prime minister, Jacinda Ardern, on a trade mission to Singapore and Japan.

Amelia completed Year 13 at Westlake Girls High School in 1989. She then completed her Master of Science degree at the University of Auckland, specialising in geography (along with other papers in anthropology, ecology, and resource management).

Amelia says, "When I was younger, I would have never imagined that I would one day become a CEO as I was quite reserved as a kid. One thing I've always been passionate

about, though, is what's right and what's not right and standing up for change when it's needed. That helped me to take a deep breath and get involved in things.

During my days at Westlake Girls High School, I may not have been the easiest student, but I was always determined and stubborn about what interested me.

I think my curiosity and values have meant that I have had a really interesting journey – grabbing opportunities to do things that excite me. That means I am now leading a business that's passionate about making every day better for our people, clients and the communities we work with, and that's something I am privileged to do."

A geographer and planner by profession, Amelia has directed numerous strategic and community shaping, policy and infrastructure planning, and consultation projects across New Zealand, Australia, Samoa, Belize and the wider Asia Pacific region.

"A key focus for our business looking ahead is how we can support our clients in decarbonising our economy and nurture prosperous, resilient, and enduring communities – both now and for future generations."

She visited Westlake before the show to talk to the current fabric technology students. El has a zero-waste design approach, where every fabric part is used when designing a garment.

In Year 12, she entered the Hokonui Fashion Design Awards, winning the Recycled Garment section and the Supreme Award for the High School section. In Year 13, she was First in Subject for Fabric Technology and Art Photography.

El's former Fabric Technology teacher, Ms Kate Luisetti, was delighted to attend the graduate show to see El's garments.

Annuska Menoita, Gold-Winning Designer



Congratulations to former student **Annuska Menoita (Class of 2014)**, the lead designer at Wonder Group, an interior design agency based in Auckland. She and her team have won gold at the prestigious NZ Design Awards 2023 for their entry in the Workplace Environments category.

Annuska was a sports prefect at Westlake with a strong interest in graphics and design. She graduated with a Bachelor of Architecture from the University of Auckland in 2018 and has worked in architectural and interior design since then. She has recently moved to Amsterdam to gain further experience in her field.

Young Enterprise Scheme



Charlotte Print (2020) has received the Young Enterprise Scheme (YES) Community Leader of the Year award at the recent YES Alumni Awards for her work as CEO of Velocity, a student-led entrepreneurship programme at the University of Auckland, and for her work with *Kairos*.

Kairos is a social enterprise educational start-up that Charlotte co-founded to help bridge the gap between low and high-decile schools, promoting tertiary educational opportunities by providing resources, workshops, and ongoing mentoring. Charlotte had wide-ranging interests at Westlake, including involvement in the YES programme, athletics, World Vision, Amnesty, and Philosophy Club. She also achieved significant academic accomplishments with three NCEA Scholarship awards and was named Proxime Accessit in 2020.
