
Dancing towards Success with AIMES

AIMES Emerging Talent Award

Anja Filip (Class of 2022) received a North Harbour Club AIMES Emerging Talent Award, sponsored by Bellingham Wallace, and a cash grant of \$7,500. She is studying for a Bachelor's Degree in Sustainability and Outdoor Education at Ara, the Institute of Canterbury in Christchurch.

At Westlake, Anja founded Westlake Kaitiaki, teaching other students practical conservation skills such as pest trapping, tree planting and water testing. The group adopted nearby Smiths Bush for their environmental work.

Anja is a Forest and Bird Youth Auckland leader and is on national committees. In 2021, she gained a scholarship from the Hyundai Pinnacle leadership programme. In 2022, she was a delegate on the BLAKE Inspire programme.

After completing her degree, Anja plans to tramp the 3,000 km Te Araroa trail, stopping at schools and communities to collaborate with them on starting conservation projects. She then wants to make her Te Araroa/Westlake Kaitiaki initiative a national organisation.

Tara made her international debut in canoe racing just last year as a member of the NZ K4 boat in the World Cup in the Czech Republic. This is an impressive feat, as she only

took up the sport three years ago, after many years as a surf lifesaver.

There are two Westlakers in the national water polo squad in 2023 – **Emily Nicholson** (Class of 2016) and **Bridget Layburn** (Class of 2018).

Emily Nicholson was in the 2016 premier Westlake team that won the national title. She debuted in the senior women's national team in 2018 and competed in World Cups in 2018 and 2022. Emily received a scholarship to study at Fresno State University in California and has completed her Bachelor's Degree in Criminology. She currently plays for Tenerife Echeyde, based in the Canary Islands. Emily competed in the World Aquatics Championship in Fukuoka in July 2023.

Bridget Layburn first made the senior team in 2018 and competed in the 2018 World League in 2018 and 2019. She is studying at the University of Hawaii on an athletic and academic scholarship, doing a Bachelor of Arts in Psychology. She hopes to pursue a postgrad in Communication Sciences and Disorders.

At Westlake, she was a prefect, Head of Onewa House, played in the premier water polo team, was a student coach of netball and water polo, and received Sporting Excellence awards.

Culinary

MasterChef NZ Contestant

Alice Taylor (Class of 2017) was one of the contestants on MasterChef NZ. She came third in the competition, earning high praise for her skills and a job offer from one of the judges, Michael Dearth of Baduzzi Restaurant in Auckland. Alice began work there two weeks after filming finished.

In March this year, Alice got a call from another of the competition judges, Vaughan Mabee, and recently accepted a job offer as pastry commis chef at his acclaimed restaurant Amisfield at Lake Hayes, Queenstown.

At Westlake, Alice was interested in Food Technology, coming first in Y13 Food Technology and gaining Level 3 NCEA with Excellence. She headed to Otago University, initially studying a Law/Arts conjoint degree, before deciding to focus on her Arts Degree. Last year she completed a Master's in Politics, specialising in Taiwanese Foreign Policy and Security Studies. Alice handed in her dissertation just two days before she flew to Queenstown to audition for MasterChef.

Simran Kaur (Class of 2014) is the co-founder and co-host of the world's biggest stock market podcast – *Girls That Invest*. She reached this milestone in a remarkably short time. She and long-time friend Sonya Gupthan founded the media platform in 2020, aiming to help women, particularly millennials and Gen Z, navigate the world of investing. They now have followers in over 60 countries and have helped thousands of women towards financial literacy. In 2016, Simran also founded the international platform, 'The Indian Feminist', which has over 300,000 members.

At Westlake, Simran was active as a Prefect and Amnesty Leader and gained academic awards in her science-oriented studies.

Simran studied Optometry at the University of Auckland, graduating with a Bachelor in Optometry (Hons) in 2019. She worked as an optometrist in Hamilton for 2 years. She became interested in finance and completed the Certificate in Financial Markets (Yale) in 2020. This, combined with a dream to buy her first house, inspired her to find a way to make basic information on investing less complicated and more accessible.

International Scholarships

Woolf Fisher Scholarship

Florence Layburn (Class of 2017) has been awarded a Woolf Fisher Scholarship and has begun her PhD studies at the University of Cambridge. She has an academic background in neuroscience and biomedical science and gained a Bachelor of Biomedical Science with First Class Honours at the University of Auckland. Her PhD studies are in the University of Cambridge's Chemistry Department, studying the role of alpha-synuclein protein aggregation in Parkinson's disease to support the development of new diagnostics and treatments for this devastating neurodegenerative disorder.

Florence was involved in science through her schooling at Westlake, including the Science Fair, Rotary National Science Forum and the Hands-On programme at the University of Otago. She was a Prefect, a keen sportswoman, and involved in coaching and tutoring junior students. Florence rowed at school from Year 10 and now enjoys rowing at Cambridge.

Reflecting on her time at Westlake, Florence says, "Westlake provided a challenging academic environment that made me feel prepared to tackle first-year university. I am grateful to have had such excellent STEM teachers during my time at Westlake, all of whom worked enthusiastically to cultivate an atmosphere of fun and curiosity in the classroom. The values I learned regarding collaboration and an open-minded approach to problem-solving provided the foundation for growth during my time at UoA, and ultimately having the great privilege of being awarded the Woolf Fisher Scholarship."

In 2021, Naomi was part of the Auckland Junior Girls Development Squad, and this year has competed in U19 North Island and South Island golf tournaments representing the Futures Waikato Golf Club.

At Westlake, Naomi was a member of the Senior Golf team, which competed in the North Harbour Secondary School Golf League. Other interests included Dance, Stage Challenge, and Gymsports. She also achieved Level 3 NCEA with Excellence.



US Basketball Scholarship

Makenzee was in the top basketball teams throughout her time at Westlake. She was captain in her final year and the leading scorer. Three Westlakers in Politics

Three Westlakers were elected to councils or boards in the October 2022 Local Government elections: Julia Parfitt, Hibiscus and Bays Local Board, Janet Tupou, Kaipātiki Local Board, and Amanda Clinton-Gohdes, New Plymouth District Council.

Julia Parfitt (Class of 1970) was re-elected to the Hibiscus and Bays Local Board. She is a lifelong Shore resident with extensive experience advocating for numerous community groups and projects on Auckland's North Shore.

Julia was at Westlake in the late 60s and completed her final year at Rangitoto College. She subsequently trained as a primary teacher and taught and was then a board member at Northcross Intermediate

Her impressive career in local government started with North Shore City, where she was a Councillor and Deputy Mayor. She is a long-serving Hibiscus and Bays Board member and the current Deputy Chair.

Reflecting on Westlake, Julia says, "At Westlake Girls, I had Helen Ryburn as my fifth-form History teacher. She was an inspirational, no-nonsense teacher, and the next year she went on to become our principal. We later became good friends serving on the East Coast Bays Community Board and North Shore City Council together.

I was privileged to give a eulogy at her funeral on behalf of her former students. She possibly inspired me to put my name forward to serve on the Student Council in my 6th form year. She certainly encouraged us to think about the importance of politics and the effects, both adverse and positive it could have on people's lives.

Since leaving Westlake Girls, I have continued to have a good relationship with the school. I was extremely pleased to be invited to a number of functions and in particular, to the inaugural function for the new principal Jane Stanley."



Dr Janet Tupou (Class of 2005) has been elected to the Kaipātiki Local Board. She gained her PhD in Communication Studies at AUT, where she now lectures. She is also the Director of the Wellbeing, Inclusion and Diversity Board of the Communication School. Janet has been involved in many projects and initiatives where her research and evaluation skills and community involvement are invaluable. Janet is also a Board Member of the Fale Pasifika Women's Refuge.

Janet was Deputy Head Girl at Westlake in 2005. Janet says, 'I'm always a swan girl at heart, and am keen to support any events and activities that Westlake holds for the community. A key part of my plans is ensuring that young people have a voice through the local board and supporting their dreams and aspirations.'

Amanda Clinton-Gohdes (Class of 2004) was re-elected to the New Plymouth District Council for her second term as Councillor. Her Council roles have included Chair of the Climate Change, member of the Zero Waste and Sustainability Committee and member of Finance and Strategic Projects committees. In her first term, she chaired the Community Funding Investment Committee and will be chairing the Finance Audit and Risk Committee this term. Amanda has a BSc and Honours degree in Law and a Level 4 Certificate in Te Reo Māori.



She has experience in research, tertiary student support, equity advice, property and commercial law, and governance in the community sector. She is a Trustee of Wild for Taranaki and a member of the Institute of Directors. Amanda has held many volunteer roles, including serving on the Board of 'Dress for Success New Plymouth'.

Reflecting on her time at Westlake,
Amanda says, "Westlake gave me a really solid academic foundation and a passion for learning, as well as a belief that women can run the world. So many of my classmates are doing amazing things at home and all over the world, and Westlake is a big part of that."
